Salient Aspects:

Economics

- Syllabus of B.A. I Economics was changed in a phased manner starting from the year 2016-17, So, in 2017-18, syllabus of B.A. II Economics was changed to make it more understandable and relevant.
- In 2017-18, in B.Com. I (Vocational) paper of Economics has been introduced, as it is very important to have the basic understanding of economics for commerce students.
- Syllabus of Economics of B.Com. I, 1st & 2nd semester was also raised to make it compatible with semester system.

Commerce

- In B.Com. I, New scheme of subjects was introduced by KUK with major changes in papers, options and contents of syllabus to make it more consistent with the needs of today's competitive & dynamic environment to equip the teachers and students with latest ICT Methods (Tally) and to inculcate human values and professional ethics by studying and teaching different subjects like Business Ethics, Principles of Management, Principles of Marketing, Consumer Behaviour, Organisational Behaviour, HRM etc.

Computer Science

- In B.Com. I (Vocational) Major changes in the nomenclature and syllabus contents were made by adding certain topics and deleting some outdated concept related topics to make the students aware of latest technological advance meets in the field of computer science.
- Subject e-commerce was introduced in B.Com. I, 2nd semester for General & SFS programmes, to make the business students well aware of digital transactions, electronic payment systems, internet securities etc.

Mathematics

Syllabus of B.Com. I, Business Mathematics was revised in the session 2017-18 as per the new scheme introduced in B.Com I (2017-18)

- To cater to the requirements of Banking system, CA preparation, Entrepreneurship, MBA and many competitive exams.
- To prepare the students for quantitative aptitude.
- To predict the way the economy will behave in the next few years and to come up with realistic predictions.
- To prepare the students for better investment, insurance, government and public administration.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell: Organises various extension lecturers and mock tests to prepare the students for various competitive exams.

Evidence of success

Many students of this institution have joined various social service groups and reputed NGO's. Through these groups students provide their services to the needy & poor. Trees are planted by the students in the surrounding parks and colonies. Door-to-door convensing and Nukkad Natak are performed regarding cleanliness. Free Coaching and health tips are given to the needy and poor people by our volunteers. Maximum attendance of the students during National festivals is observed in the campus. Students are self-disciplined during the programs and other celebrations. NCC Cadets selected in the Republic Day parade. Through such activities they are serving the society and the nation. Overall behavioural values are seen in their personal, social & professional field.

Problems encountered:

To ensure maximum participation of the students lots of efforts have to be made at entry level as most of the students come from rural area. To divert their attention in this direction & to motivate them for such activities, students are treated sympathetically, psychologically and emotionally. However irrespective of these limitations our efforts are geared towards providing the best possible for students.

Resources required

Mindset of the students and their surrounding needs to be changed through counselling. Local cable Network and media is the need of the hour for awakening the society. Besides subject teachers experts and counsellors are required to impart training. Conveyance facilities to give them social security.

2. Emphasis on morality- perspective and multidimensional approach

Students are future of India. The future of a country depends on the moral values imparted to them in their student life. Our institution tries to apprise the students to the wider aspects of morality and its much dimensional effects. Morality is neither religious nor spiritual. It denotes values. Students are made to grasp the things so that their life style and social approach should not be based on religious dogmas but on ethics.

Goals:

2. To develop constructive, positive and scientific approach towards life.
3. To adopt spiritualism as a way of life.
4. To prepare the students fight against social evils.
5. To inculcate patriotic feelings among students.

The context

Swami Dayanand ji's mission was not to start or setup any new religion but to ask mankind for universal brotherhood. Swamiji founded Arya Samaj enunciating the ten universal principles. Swamiji had a scientific & logical approach towards everything and throughout his life he advocated & practised the same.

The Practice

'Vedic Yajna' is regularly performed in our institution. Students, teachers and non-teaching staff is systematically trained from time to time by organizing workshops on 'Vedic Sanskriti', 'Vedic Chintan' and the importance and need of moral values.

In Yajna, the light from the flame of the fire is a symbol of knowledge replacing ignorance. Enlightenment of mind is enhanced by the act of chanting mantras. This form of prayer not only brings peace to the soul but its daily repetition is also an act of mental concentration that enables the mind to memorise the wisdom contained in the vedic mantras.

The desire to improve the environment is not just for the personal good but for the good of all, fostering a spirit of universal good.
