Society needs to enhance its efforts for women empowerment and to boost the progress being made by women. It is constitutional, moral and social responsibility to confirm women's progress giving women equal opportunities and rights. Our Institution lays more emphasis on overall personality development of students.

Goals:-

The Context:

Dayanand Mahila Mahavidyalaya portrays the ideals of Maharshi Dayanand who always advocated equal rights for women such as right to education and reading of Indian scriptures. Present day scenario demands economic independence of women through education.

The Practice:

Carrer Guidance Cell, Placement Cell, NSS, NCC, Women Cell, Legal Literacy Cell and Tutors are dedicated to provide their services and counselling to girl students to be self dependent and career conscious.

Few practices:

1. Students are trained for self employment by giving them expertise in the thinks like making of soft toys, flower making, mehendi, makeup, ornamental things from waste material, shorthand practice and fashion designing etc.
2. By organising lectures/classes on various careers like Teaching, Banking, Administrative exams, Net exams and HTET exam etc.
3. Zudo classes for women safety are organised from time to time by NSS.
4. Distributing plants every year for the students who have space in their houses under the scheme "Haryala Angan".

Counselling:

Doctors, academicians, & social activists are invited from time to time to counsel the students for

1. Inculcating moral values.
2. Taking care of their mental and physical health & hygiene.
3. Conducting programmes to counsel students for best career options.
4. Counselling for personal problems.

Outcome of all these programmes, campaigns & counselling is very encouraging. Students became confidant about their role and position in the society.

Evidence of success

- Students are becoming career conscious.
- Students are becoming more confident.

Activities:

Career and Placement Cell organises various extension lectures to make the students aware of different careers and competitive exams.

Eco- club has been established in our college to make the students aware about environment protection. Besides this club, NSS, NCC unit and various other societies also organize different activities from time to time to encourage the students to keep the environment clean and green.

Free medical facilities, health checkups and health awareness campaigns are organized by Red-Cross, NSS, NCC in an integrated manner for students.

Women Cell and Legal Literacy Cell organized Extension lectures, plays, Seminars, Legal Aid Camps, Legal Literacy Camps for sensitizing on social legal and political issues like gender discrimination, human rights, dowry menace etc. Providing knowledge about various women related laws, is a regular feature for personality development.

2. Conveyance facility (so as to reach the community).

2. Emphasis on morality- perspective and multidimensional approach

Students are future of India. The future of a country depends on the moral values imparted to them in their student life. Our institution tries to apprise the students to the wider aspects of morality and its much dimensional effects. Morality is neither religious nor spiritual. It denotes values. Students are made to grasp the things so that their life style and social approach should not be based on religious dogmas but on ethics.

Goals:

2. To develop constructive, positive and scientific approach towards life.
3. To adopt spiritualism as a way of life.
4. To prepare the students fight against social evils.
5. To inculcate patriotic feelings among students.

The context

Swami Dayanand ji's mission was not to start or setup any new religion but to ask mankind for universal brotherhood. Swamiji founded Arya Samaj enunciating the ten universal principles. Swamiji had a scientific & logical approach towards everything and throughout his life he advocated & practised the same.

The Practice

'Vedic Yajna' is regularly performed in our institution. Students, teachers and non-teaching staff is systematically trained from time to time by organizing workshops on 'Vedic Sanskriti', 'Vedic Chintan' and the importance and need of moral values.

In Yajna, the light from the flame of the fire is a symbol of knowledge replacing ignorance. Enlightenment of mind is enhanced by the act of chanting mantras. This form of prayer not only brings peace to the soul but its daily repetition is also an act of mental concentration that enables the mind to memorise the wisdom contained in the vedic mantras.

The desire to improve the environment is not just for the personal good but for the good of all, fostering a spirit of universal good.

3. Students intake of comparatively lower academic performance due to Kurukshetra University being locally situated.
4. Students from rural background are not well aware of professional courses.

Opportunities:

- New and relevant courses can be started.
- Students can use internet facility in labs and library and be updated.

Threats:

1. More competition as the number of educational institutions is increasing.
2. Lengthy syllabi are to be completed in short time due to semester system. With students of less calibre, it becomes all the more challenging.
3. Frequent changes in curriculum are not informed in time so students and teachers both face difficulty in completing the syllabi.
4. To keep pace with latest technology especially for the students with rural background.
5. Students of high merit prefer Kurukshetra University to this college in spite of better results of our college.

- To get installed Solar system for energy conservation.
- To organise National/International/State level seminars, workshops and FDPs etc.
- To undertake the various extension activities.
- To organise various co-curricular activities (cultural & sports)
- To increase the library resources.
