The Context:

Dayanand Mahila Mahavidyalaya portrays the ideals of Maharshi Dayanand who always advocated equal rights for women such as right to education and reading of Indian scriptures. Present day scenario demands economic independence of women through education.

The Practice:

Carrer Guidance Cell, Placement Cell, NSS, NCC, Women Cell, Legal Literacy Cell and Tutors are dedicated to provide their services and counselling to girl students to be self dependent and career conscious.

Few practices:

- 1. Students are trained for self employment by giving them expertise in the thinks like making of soft toys, flower making, mehandi, makeup, ornamental things from waste material, shorthand practice and fashion designing etc.
- By organising lectures/classes on various careers like Teaching, Banking, Administrative exams, Net exams and HTET exam etc.
- 3. Zudo classes for women safety are organised from time to time by NSS.

2. Emphasis on morality- perspective and multidimensional approach

Besides this club, NSS, NCC unit and various other societies also organize different activities from time to time to encourage the students to keep the environment clean and green. 'Environmental studies' is taught as a compulsory paper to the students of all classes e.g. BA, B.Com, BTM & B. Sc. in 1st year so that students can be aware of problems of environment pollution. Moreover, Havan Yajna is also performed every Monday to keep the campus environment pollution free.

Activities performed during the year 2015-16

- 1. 18-08-2015 Tree plantation by NSS Volunteers to celebrate Van Mahotsav.
- 02-10-2015 One Day Camp on Gandhi Jayanti was organised by NSS. Students cleaned the Hall of College under Swachchta Abhiyaan.
- 3. 25-09-2015 to 31-10-2015 Under <u>Swachch Bharat Mission</u> programme, NSS and cleanliness committee took the initiative along with Principal, teachers & non-teaching employees to clean the college campus, rooms, offices, labs, roofs, bathrooms etc.

- 4. 16 to 22-12-2015 Seven days camp was organised in the college by NSS in which one whole day was contributed to the cleanliness of college.
- 5. 22-12-2015 One day workshop was organised on Hawan-Yajna by Arya Yuwati Parishad in which 80 students participated to learn the procedure of performing yajna with a view to keep the environment pure & pious.

Students are always motivated not to use the polybags in the campus or outside the campus and also to conserve the energy.

- 5. Students of high merit prefer Kurukshetra University to this college in spite of better results of our college.
