Musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs) include all forms of ill health ranging from light, transitory disorders to irreversible, and disabling injuries. #### Introduction

Musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs) denote problems of the locomotor apparatus i.e. muscles, tendons, the skeleton, cartilage, ligaments and nerves. Musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs) include all forms of ill health ranging from light, transitory disorder to irreversible, disabling injuries (Luttmann 2003). Tendinitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, osteoarthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, fibromyalgia, bone fractures are some of the examples of MSDs. Musculoskeletal disorders (MSDs) are induced or aggravated by work and the circumstances of its performance (Bernard 1997).

Work-related Musculoskeletal Disorders (WMSD) are conditions in which:

- The work environment and performance of work contribute significantly to the condition.
- The condition is made worse or persists longer due to work conditions

Examples of work conditions that may lead to WMSDs include routine litting of heavy objects, daily exposure to whole body vibration, routine overhead work, work with the neck in chronic flex on position, or performing expelling overful tasks (Bernard 1997).

Most Important work related Musculoskeletal Disorders are:

- Tendinitis: Tendons are thick cords that join muscles to bones. When tendons become irritated or inflamed. the condition is called tendinitis. Tendinitis causes acute pain and tenderness, making it difficult to move the affected joint.
- Carpal tunnel syndrome: Carpal tunnel syndrome is the compression of the median nerve as it passes into the hand. The median nerve is located on the palm side of hand (also called the carpal tunnel). The median nerve provides sensation (ability to feel) to thumb, index finger, long finger, and part of the ring finger. It supplies the impulse to the muscle going to the thumb. Carpal tunnel syndrome can occur in one or both of the hands. Swelling inside wrist causes the compression in carpal tunnel syndrome. It can lead to numbness, weakness, and tingling on the side of your hand near the thumb.
  - Osteoarthritis: It is the most common chronic condition of the joints. It occurs when the cartilage or cushion between joints breaks down leading to pain. stiffness and swelling.
  - Rheumaioid arthritis: It is an autoimmune disease in which the body's immune system - which normally protects its health by attacking foreign substances like bacteria and viruses - mistakenly attacks the joints.

Fibromyalgia: Fibromyalgia is a long-term or chronic Aftested to be associated with widespread pain in the muscles and true copyas of tenderness, and general

Bone fractures: A bone fracture is a condition in which there is damage in the continuity of the bone or in other words broken bone.

#### **Biomechanics**

The study of the action of external and internal forces on the livingbody, especially on the skeletal system is called Biomechanics or Biomechanics is the study of human movement and interaction with the environment. There is a significant risk of injury when undertaking physical activities.

Some Recognized Biomechanical Risk Factors for Musculoskeletal Disorders are:

- Forceful exertion: Force is the amount of effort required to perform a task or job. Lifting, pushing, pulling and gripping something are the examples of activities that require exerting force or muscling effort. Muscle effort increases in response to high force requirements, increasing associated fatigue which can lead to MSD.
- Repetitive movements: Movements performed over and over are called repetitive movements. Mopping and washing of utensils are the examples of repetitive tasks. High task repetition, when combined with other risks factors such high force and/or awkward postures, can contribute to the formation of MSD. A job is considered highly repetitive if the cycle time is 30 seconds or less.
  - Awkward postures: Awkward postures are those in which joints are held or moved away from the body's natural position. Examples are stooping thending over), kneeling, and reaching overhead like in mopping the floor. Awkward postures place excessive force on

joints and overload the muscles and tendons around the effected joint. Joints of the body are most efficient when they operate closest to the mid-range motion of the joint. Risk of MSD is increased when joints are worked outside of this mid-range repetitively or for sustained periods of time without adequate recovery time.

#### Secondary Risk Factors

- Contact pressure: is any external pressure applied to soft tissues of the body. Holding tools where handles press into parts of the hand is an example of contact pressure.
- Vibration: can cause damage to nerves and blood vessels as well as other soft tissues.

So the primary biomechanical risk factors for MSDs were awkward posture, heavy physical work otherwise known as forceful exertion, long duration of work and high frequency of work.

#### POPULATION & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT IN INDIA

A country's population growth is proportional to the country's Gross national per capita income. Is it directly proportional or not, is a debatable topic. Few suggest as the population grows as we get more labor & hands to work.

Inversely proportional, on the other side of the debate, as the population grows the demand of the goods also increases. So the pace at which either of the two grows, i.e population v/s production balances the economic growth on the national standards.

The credentials which are crucial for the balance of population growth & economic development are:

- 1) As the population increases the dependency of "food & shelter" increases leading to the less savings & more expenditures. Eventually the capital formation goes down. So when the population is increasing at a certain pace, comparatively larger investments are needed to maintain the current level of income.
- 2) When the population growth exceeds than the normal balancing with the growth capita, it needs to increase. To create resources for the increasing population govt. has to invest in the non productive investments like societies, parks etc instead of machinery & industries.
- 3) Quantity v/s Quantity- To keep both hand in hand is one challenging task. Absorbing the growing population into labour force, our ability to raise productivity gets constrained.

Govt. has adopted various policies that may be adopted to control the growth of population are::

- a) Family Planning Family planning programmes should be adopted and executed by the government. Educating people about the benefits of family planning works in the favour of the country in a longest run. Countries like china have successfully established the population control by "one family one child" policy.
- Sterilization Hospitals & education systems shall be stringently active on making people aware of the sterilization benefits. The harmless population control systems should be well prevailed.
- To increase the income rate -
- Promoting delayed marriages -
- Making available family planning methods through different outlets in urban, semi urban & rural areas.
- Incentivisation Like in corporate world incentives motivate people to work and stick to decorum, one needs to get awarded for adopting & promoting family planning measures.
- Minimum age of female marriages should be increased & also. g)
- "Family Planning" means bearing of a child should not be accidental.
- Economic growth needs to get equitable (stooping down to the family levels).

#### HUMAN CAPITAL FORMATION AND ITS IMPACT ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Human capital is the stock of knowledge, habits, social and personality attributes, including creativity embodied in the ability to perform labor so as to produce economic value. Human capital is resources in the form of skills, abilities, talents, knowledge, experience, judgment, wisdom, and intelligence possessed. It is the value that the employees of a business provide through the application of their skills, know-how, talent and expertise. It is like wealth which can be directed to accomplish the goals of a nation or economy.

In early economy theories, the assumption was that the secondary sector was producing more than Human factor was considered to be one of the factors of production. It was simply referred to as labor or work force. The assumption that workforces could be easily modeled in aggregate began to be challenged in 1950's when tertiary sector, which demanded more creativity, begun to produce more than the secondary sectors in the most developed countries in the world Management Accounting is often concerned with the questions of how to model human beings as capital assets. Human capital is vitally important for an organization's success (crook et al. 2011). According to T.W.Schuttz: there are five ways of developing human capital :-

- (i) Provision of health facilities which affect the life expectancy, strength, vigor and vitality of people.
- (ii) Provision of the on-job training which enhances the skill of labor force
- (iii) Arranging education at primary, secondary and higher levels.
- (iv) Study and extension programmer for adults.
- (v) Provision of adequate migration facilities to families to adjust to changing job opportunities.

In 2010, the OECD (the organization of economic cooperation and development) encouraged the governments of advance economies to embrace policies to increase innovation and knowledge in products and services as an economical path to continue prosperity.

#### **IMPORTANCE**

The concept of human capital has relatively less importance in labor surplus countries. These countries (e.g. INDIA) are naturally endowed with more of labor due to high birth rate under the given climatic conditions. The surplus labor in these countries is human resource available in abundance than the tangible capital resources. This surplus human resource can be transformed into human capital with effective inputs of education, health and moral values. The transformation of raw human resource into highly productive human resource with these inputs is the process of human capital formation. The problem of scarcity of tangible capital in the labor surplus countries can be resolved by accelerating the rate of human capital formation with both public and private investment in education and health sectors of national economies. Tangible financial capital is an effective instrument of promoting economic growth of the nation whereas intangible human capital is an instrument if promoting comprehensive development of the nation because it is directly related to human development and hence leads to quantitative and qualitative progress of the nation. Professor Galbraith has rightly said that "We now get larger part of economic growth from investment in men and improvements brought about by improved men."

HDI (Human Development Index), the statistical indicator of estimating human development is the combination of life expectancy Index, Education Index and Income Index. Life expectancy Index reveals the standard of health of the population, Education Index reveals the standard of education and literacy rate and Income Index reveals the standard of living. Rising trend over a long period of time in HDI components has strong correlation with economic development. #### INDIA EMERGING AS WORLD ECONOMIC SUPER POWER

Dr. Sneh Lata

The Republic of India is considered as one of the possible emerging superpowers of the world. This potential is attributed to several indicators, the primary ones being its demographic trends and a rapidly expanding economy and by GDP India became world's fastest growing economy in 2015 with 7.3% GDP rate. Country must overcome many of the economic, social, and political problems before it can be considered a superpower. It is also not yet influential on the international stage as compared to the <u>United States</u> or the former <u>Soviet Union</u>.

#### Factors in favor

The central position of India, its magnificent resources, its teeming multitude of men, its great trading harbors, its reserve of military strength, supplying an army always in a high state of efficiency and capable of being hurled at a moment's notice upon any point either of Asia or Africa--all these are assets of precious value. On the West, India must exercise a predominant influence over the destinies of Persia and Afghanistan; on the north, it can veto any rival in Tibet; on the north-east it can exert great pressure upon China, and it is one of the guardians of the autonomous existence of Siam. Possession of India gave the British Empire its global reach.

#### Possible future advantage of location

In the future, the world is expected to exit the "fossil fuel age", and perhaps the "nuclear energy age", and enter the "renewable-energy age" or even further into the "fusion power age", if and whenever these technologies become economically sustainable. Being a region in the sunny tropical belt, the Indian subcontinent could greatly benefit from a renewable energy trend, as it has the ideal combination of both - high solar insulation and a big consumer base density. For example, considering the costs of energy consumed for temperature control (a major factor influencing a region's energy intensity) and the fact that - cooling load requirements, unlike heating, are roughly in phase with the sun's intensity, cooling from the excessive solar radiation could make great energetic (and hence economic) sense in the subcontinent, whenever the required technology becomes competitively cheaper. India also has 25% of the world's thorium resources.

#### High population

India has the world's second largest population. The PGR for the country is 1.25. A very large number of India's population, consisting of 50% of the whole, is below the age group of 24. This provides the nation with a large workforce for many decades, helping in its growth. The government is training a 400 million-workforce, which is larger than the population of the United States and Brazil combined

#### Young population

Due to its high birth rate India has a young population compared to most aging nations. It has approximately 65% of its population below the age of 35. In addition, declining fertility is beginning to reduce the youth dependency rate which may produce a demographic dividend. In the coming decades, while some of the powerful nations will witness a decrease in workforce numbers, India is expected to have an increase. For example, while Europe is well past its demographic window, the United States entered its own in 1970 (lasting until 2015), China entered its own in 1990 (and will last until 2025), India would not enter its own window until 2010 (and it will last until 2050). Regionally, South Asia is supposed to maintain the youngest demographic profile after Africa and the Middle East, with the window extending up to the 2070s.

Human capital is the stock of competencies, knowledge, habits, social and personality attributes, including creativity, cognitive abilities, embodied in the ability to perform labor so as to produce economic value. The concept of Human capital has relatively more importance in labour-surplus countries. These countries are naturally endowed with more of labour due to high birth rate under the given climatic conditions.
